



Château D'ESCLANS

CÔTES DE PROVENCE 2019

Grapes grown from Chateau d'Esclans' vineyard, consisting primarily of Grenache and Rolle (Vermentino). Harvesting at sunrise to noon. Grapes are sorted by optical eye electronically and manually three times. Destemming and slight crushing at 7-8°C to avoid oxidation. Free run juice and first slight pressing. No maceration. Both free run juice and pressed juice partially vinified in demi-muids (600L barrels) and stainless steel, both temperature controlled.

This is so yummy with sliced peaches, lemons and some stone and white pepper. Minerally. It's medium-bodied and fruity, yet subtle and very long. A beautiful rosé. Drink now and enjoy.

Light salmon pink, silver reflections. Freshly lined red forest berry jam, a hint of raspberry, inviting bouquet. Medium complexity, ripe peach, subtle sweetness, like honeydew melon, strong finish, subtle mineral touch in the finish, red cherries in the aftertaste, blossom honey in the aftertaste.

Bright color. Sophisticated nose with aroma reminiscent to berries. Roasted hazelnuts aroma developing with some oxygen, some flowery components in the background. Well-structured with rich, yet elegant mouthfeel... hints of vanilla, complex with excellent length. Marcus Del Monego

Bright pale rosé de Provence colour. Layered nose with fresh peach, ripe citrus, red currant and raspberry with mild spices and discreet wood notes underneath. Pale peach in colour, this 2020 wine very youthful with some pear drop character that will subside, a little cherry note and soft red berry fruits. On the palate Whispering Angel's trademark combination of elegant, cool precision with very easy-going, open and attractive fruitiness. Nicely textured, the raspberry fruit and edge of acidity is ripe but bone dry, and there's a hint of stony minerality adding to the sophistication of the finish.
